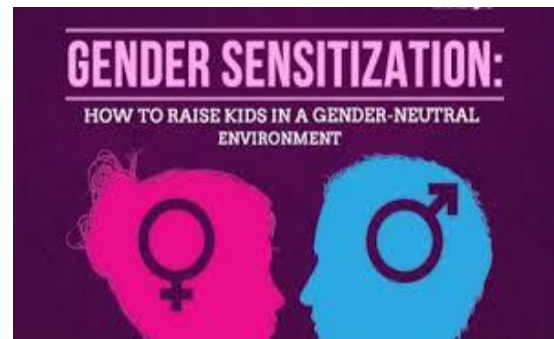
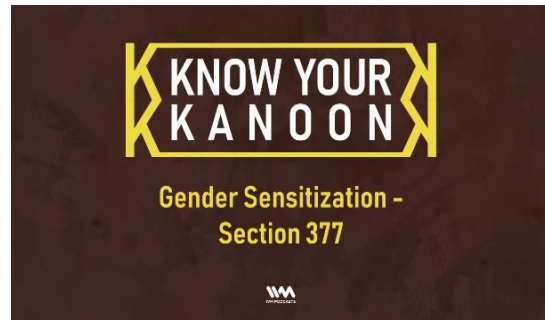

### REPORT
